9) Student Discipline

The Board has received a recommendation from the Superintendent that a student be expelled from Clinton Community Schools. Pursuant to Section 8 of Michigan's Open Meetings Act, the Board may meet in closed session to consider the dismissal, suspension, or disciplining of a student if requested by the student or their parent/guardian. MCL 15.268(1)(b).

Motion

WHEREAS:

- 1. The Clinton Community Schools administration has recommended that a student whose identity is known to the Board (the "Student") be expelled for engaging in the following conduct in violation of Clinton Community Schools' Board Policy 5206 Student Discipline; section 1311a of Michigan's Revised School Code, MCL 380.1311a(2); section 235b of Michigan's Penal Code, MCL 750.235b; and the Clinton High School Student Handbook (specifically, False Alarms, False Reports, and Bomb Threats (see page 15) and Disruption of the Educational Process (see page 16)):
 - a. Student told another Clinton High School student while at school that he would "pop" them or have someone "pop" them.
 - b. Student stated to a group of Clinton High School students while at school, "y'all are lucky I don't bring my gun to school no more."
 - c. Student, while at school, stated, "I can't take this place no more. I gotta either leave or I'm blowing this place up."
 - d. Student told another Clinton High School student while at school that the student better "watch the fuck out or I'll rearrange your face."
 - e. Student told other Clinton High School students while at school that he has killed three people; that he has three bodies on his belt; and that he will make them his bitch.
- 2. School administrators notified the Student's guardians of the specific charge underlying the discipline recommendation, as well as the date, time, and place of the disciplinary hearing.
- 3. Despite offering the Student and the Student's representatives an opportunity to respond to the charge and to present pertinent evidence for the Board's consideration, neither the Student nor any representative(s) of the Student appeared at the September 16, 2024, meeting of the Board of Education.
- 4. The Board has carefully considered all of the evidence produced in this student discipline hearing.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

- A preponderance of the evidence establishes that the Student engaged in the following conduct
 in violation of Clinton Community Schools' Board Policy 5206 Student Discipline;
 section 1311a of Michigan's Revised School Code, MCL 380.1311a(2); section 235b of
 Michigan's Penal Code, MCL 750.235b; and the Clinton High School Student Handbook
 (specifically, False Alarms, False Reports, and Bomb Threats (see page 15) and Disruption
 of the Educational Process (see page 16)):
 - a. Student told another Clinton High School student while at school that he would "pop" them or have someone "pop" them.
 - b. Student stated to a group of Clinton High School students while at school, "y'all are lucky I don't bring my gun to school no more."

- c. Student, while at school, stated, "I can't take this place no more. I gotta either leave or I'm blowing this place up."
- d. Student told another Clinton High School student while at school that the student better "watch the fuck out or I'll rearrange your face."
- e. Student told other Clinton High School students while at school that he has killed three people; that he has three bodies on his belt; and that he will make them his bitch.
- 2. Based on careful consideration of all the following factors when considering the Student's conduct in making threats against Clinton High School and Clinton High School students, the Board determines that expulsion from school is warranted:
 - The student's age;
 - The student's disciplinary history;
 - Whether the student has a disability;
 - The seriousness of the behavior;
 - Whether the behavior posed a safety risk;
 - Whether restorative practices are a better option; and
 - Whether lesser interventions would address the behavior.
- 3. The Student is expelled from Clinton Community Schools for making threats against Clinton High School and Clinton High School students.
- 2. During the time of the expulsion, the Student may not be on school grounds or attend any functions at the District without prior written approval from the Superintendent.
- 3. Consistent with Sections 11a and 1311(1) of the Revised School Code, the Board finds that the interests of the District are served by this resolution.
- 4. Administrators are directed and authorized to implement all terms of this resolution and are delegated all necessary authority to do so.
- 5. All resolutions and parts of resolutions that conflict with the provisions of this resolution are rescinded.
